SHOOTING FILM KEY POINTS

Video Ideas:

- Youtube videos (tuts, equipment /instrument tests, music philosophy etc.)
- Music videos
- Live sessions
- Experimental videos for YOUR soundscapes
- DOCUMENTING YOUR CREATIVE PROCESS
- MUSIC DOCU
- Visual showreel for your music
- Podcast (rather than just having the audio only)



Films referenced:

Tangerine

Location is very important – some things to consider:

- Interior or Exterior
- Noise
- Natural light vs Artificial light
- Creative/textural lights
- Dress the set make it look good!

Composition:

- Use the grid on your phone
- Put important elements on one of the grid lines

Framing:

- Extreme Close-Up (ECU) great for showing heightened emotions and tiny details
- Close-up (CU)
- Medium (Med) great for use in conversations and interviews.
- Wide Shot (Wide) establishes location, very important shot.

Angles (there are many, here are just a few to get you started):

- Overhead shot
- Low/ground level shot
- Dutch tilt This can be used for dramatic effect and helps portray unease, disorientation, frantic or desperate action, intoxication, madness, etc.

Story is incredibly important – create a script, storyboard and shotlist.
